Novice Oblate of St. Benedict under the guidance of the Benedictine Brotherhood of the Monastery of Our Lady and St. Laurence, a Western-rite Orthodox monastery in Colorado.

Oblates of St. Benedict (from the Latin oblatum – an offering) are Christians who have discerned a call from God to embrace formation in the Benedictine monastic tradition, while continuing to live out their vocation in the world. This formal and permanent self-offering is made manifest through spiritual communion with a specific Benedictine monastic community. Oblates vow a stability of heart, and ongoing conversion in the spirit of the Holy Rule, and obedience to the will of God, with the desire that in all things God may be glorified. “Prefer nothing whatsoever to Christ Himself,” Rule of St. Benedict of Nursia +543AD.
